#### Literacy at St Bernadette's

#### Developing Literacy Through I.T.

There is always debate over what is better - the tangible pages of a book or the interactive accessibility of an eBook. In one instance, nothing is better than flicking through the pages of a well-pawed novel or carefully opening the weathered cover of an ancient text. But yet what could be better than carrying a library of books accessible with one click? Or having the option to listen to a story retold as you walk?

I think the answer is that there are times when each is exactly what is needed and it doesn't need to be a fight for first place.

What is good though is the opportunity to utilise and come to know and love both. There are so many Apps, and they are so regularly updated and developed, that there is no exhaustive list of what is worthwhile to try out, for ways to inspire writing, reading and creativity. Even simply utilising the camera of an iPad or phone can capture all sorts of stimulus for writing and talking. Children are often looking for creating little masterpieces to later share: iMovies of scary stories, slide shows of holidays away or even favourite things, little videos of how-to's, digital drawings of scenes with captions. It does not take much to encourage children to explore creative uses of I.T. to create wonderful projects.

Just like the healthy food pyramid, it is also important to build in a healthy balance between screen time, active time and real face time, as well as online literacy and tangible texts. Developing an awareness of the importance of this balance is essential from a young age.

Like I have said, it is impossible to list all that there is in the online or interactive world of Literacy. But here are a few ideas that could be worth exploring.



**Explain Everything** is an App that is used across many learning spaces and has many tools to publish ideas. **Drawing Pad** includes decorative papers, a full range of drawing and painting tools, stamps and the option to save and share your work with others. **Strip Designer** and **Comic Life** are both very creatove publishing tools for creating comic strips, flyers and booklets. **Scribble Press** and **Book Creator** lets you create your own books, using text, drawing and photos. **Animoto** allows the user to create simple animated slide shows online to share. **Audible** is one of several Apps for audio books. As an adult, this App is wonderful for accessing a world of text again in a busy world. Listening to a story, biography or any sort of text, while walking, cleaning the house or working in the garden. As the primary role models in our children's' life, one of the greatest things we can model and teach them is a love of books!





In stage 3 last term the environmental team went to the Easter show and learnt lots about different animals and we learnt new things we never knew. When we got back to school we focused on sheep and what they produce. Sheep are originally from Europe and Asia there are around 50 different breeds worldwide. Sheep are farmed for meat, milk and commonly wool and the fibres stored in the wool. Wool fibres are used for clothing, blankets and much more. Wool has lanolin. Lanolin keeps the wool and the sheep moisturised.

### **FLAWED GOODNESS!**

Gospel in Life

We have a tendency to divide people into two categories: saints and sinners. However, this division is quite unreal. People are not so easily categorised. Human beings are complex and we find that things that are at odds with one another co-existing in the same human being.

Many people were inspired by the story of Oskar Schindler, the German industrialist, who saved over a thousand Polish Jews from concentration camps. One of the people he saved said of him, 'He was our father, our mother, our only hope. He never let us down'. Yet many who saw the film *Schindler's List* were surprised, if not quite put off, by his vices. Hew was an endowed man with all the human vices. Hence, he constitutes something of a moral puzzle.

Schindler certainly was no saint. In fact, he was riddled with contradictions. Unfaithful to his wife, he certainly knew how to enjoy the so-called good live - cigars, drink, women. He was a Catholic, but in name only. He also was a member of the Nazi party, and his avowed aim was to end the war with 'two trunks full of money'. He exploited the Jews as a source of cheap labour. But there was another side to him, and in spite of his lapses, he always returned to that better side. There was basic goodness about him. As the war went on he became appalled at the horrors of 'the final solution'. At considerable personal risk (he was twice arrested by the Nazis), he protected his workers from death camps, thereby showing that he was undoubtedly a courageous man. But Schindler was no angel. He was a mere human being, an essentially good human being, even though his goodness was seriously flawed. We wonder what he might have achieved had he not been so divided. And the Nazis, for all the horrific things they did, weren't totally evil either. They were not devils incarnate. They too were human beings, though bad human beings.

Some people don't seem to have any understanding of the divided nature of each human being - of the co-existence in every person of good and evil, strength and weakness, loyalty and betrayal. As soon as they discover a weakness in someone, they write the person off. Their hero must be perfect. As soon as a flaw or a crack appears, they lose faith in him or her.

But things are not that simple. Human beings are complex - and that includes each of us. We are an extraordinary mixture of good and bad. Moreover, the roots of good are so entwined with roots of evil that one can't be pulled up without pulling up the other. We must learn to be patient and lenient, towards ourselves in the first place. We must be hospitable towards all that we are. We must acknowledge the dark side of ourselves, without conceding victory to it. We must struggle on in spite of the weeds, confident that with God's help, the good will finally triumph.
