# From the Principal

#### **Student Attendance**

We started this year with an ambitious goal of achieving 93% student attendance. We are currently achieving 89% student achievement, 1% point below the diocese target and 4% points below our own school target.

To date much has been achieved at St Bernadette's to enable positive student attendance. We continue to improve our attendance rate knowing that every day a student spends at school makes a positive contribution to her/his educational outcomes.

This week I have turned my attention to addressing a growing concern around Partial Absences. Whilst we accept that at times Partial Absences are unavoidable they do need to be kept at a low level. Students who miss parts of the day may miss vital elements in a learning path. For example students from infants who are late in the morning will typically miss parts of the literacy instruction for that day.

We understand that at times appointments for a specialist and the like are unavoidable, but these need to planned and if at all possible occur outside of school hours. Lateness to school is also an ongoing concern. Working through lateness issues is a priority for parents, children and staff.

This week we will send out letters that identify students with high Partial Absences. The notes help parents to realise that this is a concern and that more attention needs to be made on minimising partial absences.

The school is here to help. If you are experiencing ongoing difficulties or challenges around partial absences or school attendance please come and meet with myself or another suitable member of staff.

#### The Right questions to Ask

Asking the right questions after the school day are important if you want to hear more than, 'It was okay', or 'Good'. Having young children myself I realise the need to ask questions that engage my boys in conversation and allow them to talk about the good things that happen each day. Too often we ask closed questions like, 'How was your day?' and we get the same old answers that often make us mad. So the challenge is to ask different questions that will get a different response.

Positive questions will allow parents to get a deeper understanding of the day their child has experienced. And once the conversation begins it will be free flowing giving parents all kinds of insights into the regular school day.

I recently found an article that listed different questions you could try. Why not choose a few and give them a go.

- 1. What was the best thing that happened at school today?
- 2. Tell me something that made you laugh today.
- 3. If you could choose, who would you like to sit by in class?
- 4. Where is the coolest place at the school?
- 5. Tell me a weird word that you heard today. (Or something weird that someone said.)
- 6. If I called your teacher tonight, what would she tell me about you?
- 7. How did you help somebody today?
- 8. How did somebody help you today?
- 9. Tell me one thing that you learned today.

- 10. When were you the happiest today?
- 11. When were you bored today?
- 12. If an alien spaceship came to your class and beamed someone up, who would you want them to take?
- 13. Who would you like to play with at recess that you've never played with before?
- 14. Tell me something good that happened today.
- 15. What word did your teacher say most today?
- 16. What do you think you should do/learn more of at school?
- 17. What do you think you should do/learn less of at school?
- 18. Who in your class do you think you could be nicer to?
- 19. Where do you play the most at recess?
- 20. Who is the funniest person in your class? Why is he/she so funny?
- 21. What was your favourite part of lunch?
- 22. If you got to be the teacher tomorrow, what would you do?
- 23. If you could switch seats with anyone in the class, who would you trade with? Why?
- 24. Tell me about three different times you used your pencil today at school.

#### **Early Drop Off**

Recently the staff have brought to my attention the amount of children who are arrive early to school. Whilst we recognise that this is due to family obligations such as work and sibling drop offs it is important that parents are aware that there is no morning supervision until 8.30am.

Whilst the school environment is safe, children without supervision are vulnerable to,

- Getting injured
- Leaving the school grounds
- Traffic within the car park and surrounds
- Being approached by non school staff
- Being engaged in activities that are inappropriate

For this reason all children arriving to school should be seated on the silver seats within the second gate. If you need to drop your children off early this is done with the understanding that there is no supervision and your child/children are left to manage themselves.

If you do need to drop your child/children off early could you discuss expectations with your child/children including,

- The designated seating area
- Staying in the designated area
- Appropriate play

Whilst I understand that early drop may be needed for some families I would request that you investigate other alternatives if this is to become your normal routine. Alternatives may include family and friend assistance or the onsite OOSH service.

#### **Professional Learning**

Project Based Learning - Foundations

This Wednesday, Thursday and Friday Ms Barrak, Mr Cowan, Mrs Galea, Mrs O'Brien and Mr Kapitanow will attend Foundation Training. The course will help teachers to understand how a Project Based Unit is structured and the need to ensure units are learning focused.

Project Based Learning - Advanced

Next Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday - Miss Mortimer, Ms Goodchild, Mrs McDonald and Mr Stennett will attend the advanced course for PBL. The course will help to deepen the Stage 3 team's understanding and implementation of PBL.

#### **NAPLAN Online**

Last Thursday Mr Cowan and Mrs McDonald attended training to help prepare the school for the trial NAPLAN online assessment which will be conducted later this term. This is a trial of the technology and not an official NAPLAN assessment.

#### Ann D Clark Lecture

Most of the staff attended the Ann D Clark lecture last night. The lecture presents current theory and innovation in education. This year Pasi Sahlberg presented the lecture.





#### THE PEARL OF WISDOM!

Gospel in Life

Once there was a teacher who desired to make progress in his career and to climb the social ladder. He worked very hard. In fact, his work was his life. He put his best hours and his best efforts into it. He had little time to appreciate his family, and even less for the enjoyment of life. It was clear to everyone where his treasure was.

But then he had a heart attack. He was taken to hospital where he lay for days, drifting in and out of consciousness, and not knowing whether he would live or die. During moments of lucidity he saw these shadowy figures by his bedside. One day those figures came into focus and he immediately recognised them. They were his wife and children who visited him faithfully every day and spent hours at his bedside.

At that moment he saw where his true treasure lay - it lay in his family, his home, in the gift of life, and of course in God. He saw how foolish he had been up to now. And he prayed with all his heart: 'Lord, give me back my life, and I'll be happy'. And he resolved that if he got well, he would turn his priorities upside down.

He made a full recovery. The day he walked out of hospital he was deliriously happy. Everything had been given back to him. Through that painful experience he acquired much wisdom. Prior to this, he was completely focussed on himself and his career. Now he decided to open himself to others and to work for them. And he was happier than he had ever been in his life.

All of us are searchers and treasure-hunters in the sense that we are looking for happiness. The goal is legitimate, but it may be that (like that teacher) we are looking in the wrong place. Jesus said, 'Where your treasure is, there will your heart be too'.

So, if we want to know what our treasure is, all we have to do is ask ourselves where our heart is. What is it that we love, that we pursue with all our hearts? There lies our treasure.

The wisdom we are talking about here is not the same as worldly wisdom. It is something deeper and very much more precious. It means knowing what is truly important in life. It means being able to see life from God's point of view, and being able to live the way God wants us to live. If we don't have that, then no matter how many possessions we have, or how successful we are, we will not be happy.

Wisdom is the pearl of great price. Once found, no one can rob us of it.
