### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome Back

Welcome to the new school year. I would particularly like to extend a warm welcome to the new families who have joined the St Bernadette's community in 2018. We are privileged to have your child/children at St Bernadette's and to have the broader family unit as a part of the wider school community.

The school year always begins with a frenzy. Teachers are frantically getting their classrooms and programmes prepared whilst parents are purchasing school supplies, uniforms and lunch box goodies. It's a busy time and one we all hope will be a positive experience as students begin to roll up for the first day of school.

It's comforting to see how settled our first week and a half of school has been. Lots of work in the holidays and planning for how we would begin the school year to create a calm and settled school is paying off.

We have approached 2018 with a new perspective and a new focus. The key word for the staff is, Consistency! We are striving for consistency across all elements of the school including learning, behaviour management and routine procedures and processes that make our school.

The staff are working hard to ensure whole school expectations are enforced. To best enable this we require parental support. We rely on parents to

support the school's expectations regarding how students conduct themselves in classrooms and on the playground. Supporting teachers as they implement and enforce whole school expectations is important. Parents need to listen to their children but understand that often they are getting one side of the story. A teacher's role is to see all sides of a situation and then apply the school expectations fairly and consistently.

We want St Bernadette's to be a school we are all proud of. The teachers are working hard to build a positive culture at St Bernadette's. The staff need the assistance of the wider school community to help build a culture we can all be proud of. Sharing what we do well with others is important. We are not perfect and at times we make choices that don't appear correct. What's important in these instances is to know that we are open to hear parental concerns or constructive advice on how we can improve. Parents can contact myself or a member of the Leadership Team at any time.

This year it would be great to see more parents actively involved in the daily operations of the school. Parents have many opportunities to share their skills and time. Volunteering at school is proven to be one of the greatest things you can do for your own child's education. 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#### Uniform

Last year at the Term 3 Parent Meeting it was decided that the school expectation that students wear predominately white shoes for sport be maintained. This was heavily advertised last year. This

expectation will be enforced from week 3 along with all other uniform expectations. Notes will not be accepted for in correct uniforms. It is a school expectation that all students wear full school uniform at all times. If you have any issues with adhering to this expectation please contact myself to discuss.

### New additions to Playground

In the school holidays we installed two basketball rings under the middle shadecloth. The basketball rings will allow students another play outlet at lunch. Students in Stage 2 and 3 will be able to use the basketball rings on alternate days.

### Behaviour Management

The staff began this year by agreeing that there was a need to improve school wide consistency. School wide consistency is vital if we all want

to operate within a school that is fair and just for all. One of the main areas we will be addressing is to develop consistent practices and understanding about Behaviour Management. Together we have acknowledged the need for a consistent approach that begins with a solid understanding of the four long standing Whole School Expectations.



l am a Learner

l am Responsible

l am Respectful

l am Safe

These four very simple yet explicit school wide expectations underpin all behaviour at St Bernadette's.



All students in all stages are expected to follow these expectations. To enable this we have identified areas in the school in which the expectations need to be explicitly unpacked with students. The areas include, the classroom, recess and lunch, eating time, line up, toilets, assembly, library, excursions and incursions, canteen, Church, open days and wet weather. As a staff we have agreed to focus on improving Classroom expectations and whole school line procedures.

To enable understanding by all students each stage was asked to collaboratively develop 'Y Charts' detailing what the whole school expectations, I am a learner, I am respectful, I am responsible and I am safe, look like, sound like and feel like when in the classroom and during whole school line up times. As a school we will utilise this consistent language to discuss expectations with students.

Signage has been put in place in all student areas of the school to help students understand and know our four school wide expectations.

### Classroom Management

On a more practical sense the staff then developed a consistent classroom behaviour management system which has been implemented across all stages and all learning spaces. The system was commonly used last year throughout the school with different labels, steps and implementation standards. This year we have implemented one consistent system.

Some changes to the system include,

- 1. It is consistent throughout the school. This means that students will not need to know multiple systems or learn new systems when changing grades or learning spaces.
- 2. The system is cyclic. This means that when a student reaches the top, Outstanding they receive a stage decided token to acknowledge their outstanding behaviour. The student is then moved back to, Ready to Learn in order to receive additional tokens.
- 3. Students who move down the system receive multiple opportunities to address their behaviour. The Warning tag has been replaced by Think About It. This change in language is deliberate. We hope it will single to students that they are not in trouble, rather they have an opportunity to modify their behaviour.
- 4. If a student reaches the bottom of the system this will result in Contact with either the Leadership Team and or Parents. Parental contact is vital to ensure families are aware of their child's behaviour and are afforded the opportunity to work with their child to change behaviour.

It would be beneficial for all parents to discuss this new system with their child. This will ensure students know that their parents and the school are working together as a unified team.



The system will be implemented when school begins. As a staff we will work together to ensure the implementation is effective in all learning spaces.

### SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

### SUPERVISION

Schools are responsible for offering a safe and supportive environment for the students in their care. At St Bernadette's our supervision times are as follows:

Morning 8.30am until the school bell at 8.55am and Afternoon 3.15pm until 3.30pm.

Any student who has not been collected at 3.30pm will be taken to the school office for collection.

# COMMUNICATIONS WITH CLASS TEACHERS

If you have a concern about a matter, you can first make an appointment to speak to the classroom teacher. If you still feel the need to discuss the matter further, then please contact the school office to make an appointment to speak to a member of the Leadership Team.

### VISITORS PROTOCOL

It is both a legal requirement and a safety issue that ALL visitors report to the office and sign in and out using our visitors portal. This is necessary in the unlikely event of a fire, evacuation, lockdown etc, but more importantly for the safety of the students in our care. Once signed in a sticker will be printed that must be worn whilst on school grounds.

Thank you for your support in the important matter.

### MORNING GATES

The school day commences when the first bell rings at 8:55am. It is expected that students are present for the morning assembly, which is a part of the regular school day.

The school gates are locked at 9:00am. Students who arrive after this time are regarded as late and must go through the office with a parent to be scanned in to the school.

l realise that at times it can be a challenge to be on time everyday, however the same expectations must apply to all families. If this presents an issue for your family can you please make contact the Principal to discuss.

### KISS and DROP

Kiss and Drop is a service provided to the parents of St Bernadette's and is run by the Parent Community Group. Kiss and Drop is available mornings 8.30am-9.00am and afternoons from 3.15pm-3.30pm.

You can find a copy of our Kiss and Drop guidelines on our website. If you need a sign for your dashboard please contact the school office (phone us, call in or email us).

Kiss and Drop is in need of parent volunteers to help out. Please contact the school office if you can help any day.

### LATE DROP OFF / EARLY COLLECTION

If you arrive after 9am you must escort your child / children to the school office to be scanned in by the School Secretary.

If you need to collect your child / children early please go to the office to have you child / children scanned out in the same manner.

You will be given a key to go to the classroom to collect your child. Only parents or emergency contact on our database will be permitted to collect students.

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### STUDENT ATTENDANCE

St Bernadette's staff closely monitor individual student attendance. Our goal is to ensure all student attendance is maximised and can be deemed as regular or above 90%. The management of school attendance is co-ordinated by the School Welfare Team. The Team meet weekly to discuss any concerns about individual students. Concerns arise when student's attendance is deemed emerging, chronic or complex.

The school has a number of procedures that are implemented to assist students and parents, and to help the school develop a clearer understanding of any family challenges. Our goal is to work with families to resolve attendance issues.

In addition to full day absences off school we also closely monitor student partial absences. Being consistently late to school or leaving early has a flow on effect for individual students and teachers. Lessons are structured to start at set times and students who miss the beginning of lessons or the end of lessons are severely impacted upon. Their learning may suffer due to a lack of understanding and clarity about a task. The impact on teaching staff is that they are unable to teach the class as their attention moves to explaining tasks to individual children who arrive late. This is also disruptive for the class when children arrive late or leave early on a regular basis.

It is largely recognised that students who are absent from school will be disadvantaged in their learning progress and ongoing development. To maximise the benefits of education for all students, schools are required to follow legislative requirements of the *Education Act 1990* to monitor student attendance effectively. If you need any assistance in regards to school attendance please make contact with the school. By acting early we are able to better assist you and your family.

### **BIRTHDAYS**

If your child is having a birthday at school our teaching staff are happy to hand out small treats to the class on their behalf. Due to work health and safety regulations we are unable to have cakes with candles or take knives to the classrooms so no cakes are to be sent in to be cut up for the class.

### SCHOOL FEES

Term 1 school fee accounts will be mailed out by the Catholic Education Office (CEO) on the 19th February and will be due for payment on the 21st March. You will be invited to apply for a Flexible Payment Plan (FPP). If interested please follow the instructions given by CEO carefully and return all documentation to the Catholic Education Office by the due date otherwise your application will not make it in time and you may not be notified. However, if you miss out on an FPP, families are also welcome to call the school and set up a payment plan to suit their budget. Payments may be directly debited from your bank account, Centrelink family payments, set up through Net banking via Bpay, paid at the Post Office or simply paid at the school office. Large sums of cash sent with your child to school is not advisable. If you have had a payment arrangement in 2017 and wish to continue with a similar plan please contact the office by phone, email or letter in order to setup a new arrangement as all arrangements need to be renewed annually. It is important to know that unless you are paying your fees by the due date you will need to have a formalised arrangement in place. Please do not hesitate to contact Mrs Rita Mizzi on 98869 6400 if you have any questions or you are having difficulty with paying your school fees.

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### SCHOOL BANKING

St Bernadette's School Banking day is a Thursday and it will commence in **Week 3, Term 1.**You must have a Commonwealth Bank Dollarmites account to register for school banking and you can open an account at any of their branches.

Please hand your bank book to your teacher on a Thursday morning who will place it in the office bag. When a student makes a weekly deposit they will receive a silver token. Once they have received 10 tokens they are eligible to receive a reward prize from the Commonwealth Bank which is ordered through the School Banking Co-ordinator. The Commonwealth Bank has changed the rewards the students will receive this year. School Banking information for new students will be sent home this week.

### SICK BAY / MEDICATIONS

If your child / children are required to take medication throughout the day you must complete a medication request form. These can be found on our school website or call in to the school office to collect a copy. All medicine MUST be pre measured. School staff are not allowed to pour measures of medicine for students. Please send a note to your child's class teacher to make sure they are sent to the office at the allocated time for medicine.

### SCHOOL UNIFORM SHOP

Our school uniform shop is open every Wednesday morning 8.30am until 10.30am.

If you cannot get to the uniform shop at these times you can download an order form from our website under the "For Parents" tab and "School Notes". The order will be filled and left at the office for collection or sent home with your child.

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### SAFETY REQUEST

lt is our intention to endeavor to make our school environment as safe as possible for all. Our most urgent concerns have been for a small group of children who have severe allergy to nuts. Exposure to nut products for these children will trigger a serious reaction. Such a reaction could be fatal if not treated quickly and appropriately.

For this reason we are asking for your co-operation to help reduce the risk for these children. Ideally, this means that we strongly recommend that parents pack lunches that are <u>free from nuts</u>or nut products and <u>discouraging</u>children from sharing food at all times.

We sincerely thank each and every parent for taking time to read and consider this request. We understand that these measures will require extra thought when packing your child's lunch. Your co-operation, however, will enable these children and their families to feel supported and safe in the school environment.

### SCHOOL CANTEEN

School Canteen is open every Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Student's lunch orders are placed in their own class tub and taken to the canteen on these days. Orders must be in bags with your child's name and class clearly labelled. The Census of Catholic Schools is on tomorrow Friday 9th February. We ask that all children come to school on this day if possible. If your child is sick, we understand that they would need to stay at home, but please reply asap to the text message sent to your phone or send in a note on the following Monday explaining the absence.

If your child is too sick to return to school on Monday, you may also email an explanation on Monday to

to enable us to include your child in the Census. It is important that you quote the date of absence on your letter.

### ATTENDANCE TEXT MESSAGES

If your child / children are absent from school a text message will be forwarded to you at approximately 10.30am. We would ask that you respond to this text message with an explanation for the absence. We ask that you provide us with a valid reason and not simply responding with 'sick'. If you respond to this text message you will not have to send a note in to school upon the return of your child / children.

### STUDENT LEAVE

Student leave is not encourage outside of school holidays. If you must take leave you need to apply to the Principal completing a request for student leave. This application needs to be completed for leave of **5** days or more. You may send in a note to the class teacher for leave less than 5 days. This application can be found on our website or obtained from the school office. If the Principal approves the leave you will be given a certificate to keep with you.

### Online Applications for 2017 Now Open

Our school has partnered with Transport of NSW to use the new online process for you to submit school travel applications. **Therefore, we will now be able to process your applications online,** making it unnecessary for parents to submit a paper form to the school for endorsement.

A new application is required for students starting school or for those who have not had a travel pass before; for students progressing from Year 2 to 3; for students changing schools, and for students whose personal details have changed, such as address etc. NB. Students who do not qualify for free travel may be eligible for a Term Bus Pass instead. If you already have a current School Opal card that does not need updated DO NOT THROW IT OUT as you'll be able to use it for the 2018 school year. The Student dress code reflects school community standards and balances the rights of individual students with the best interests of the whole school community. Student dress codes clearly explain and document standards of acceptable or reasonable dress in relation to:

- clothing worn by students, including headwear and footwear
- other aspects of personal presentation of students

In the instance of hardship support, assistance can be provided where there are difficulties in complying with school uniform and dress code requirements.

### The following Student Dress Code applies at all times:

- Sport shoes/joggers are only to be worn on sport days.
- Haircuts and hairstyles should be sensible, neat and tidy, no hair colours, highlights, streaks or unusual styles
  are allowed. This includes rats tails, stripes and the excessive use of gel, etc.
- Long hair needs to be tied back.
- Junior navy blue ribbons, scrunchies and hair clips may be worn.
- NO ornate or SHARP hair clips to be worn.
- **NO** anklets, plaited cords or beads to be worn
- NO nail polish

### GIRLS – appropriate jewellery consists of:

- watch simple (no novelty, noisy or colourful watches)
- signet ring
- sleeper or stud earrings (one on each ear only)
- A simple religious chain may also be worn

### BOYS – appropriate jewellery consists of:

- watch simple (no novelty, noisy or colourful watches)
- signet ring
- simple religious chain may also be worn
- Boys are NOT allowed to wear an earring

**PLEASE NOTE:**All students must now be wearing the school bucket hat. We have had our transition period and it is now essential that the bucket hat be worn by all students. Thank you

We would appreciate your help in ensuring your child/children comply with the school's dress standards. We understand that the students are often incapable of making or organising the necessary changes in order to be compliant and so need your help. We expect all students to meet the above standards by next Monday 5th of February. If you have any foreseen difficulties in doing this please contact your child's teacher or myself.

If at any time you are unable to send your child to school in the correct uniform it would be appreciated if a note was provided detailing the issue and when we can expect it to be rectified.


