Principal's Message

Tell Them From Me Survey is currently being



completed by all staff, students in years 4 to 6 and parents. I would encourage all parents to complete the survey and ensure your input helps to shape the future direction of the school. Survey completion is anonymous and only takes 25 minutes. Your time and thoughts are deeply appreciated.

Parent communication regarding any issues is always welcomed. At St Bernadette's this year we are implementing a process that ensures issues are heard and investigated by the most appropriate person. All issues should first be directed to the class teacher. It is preferred if the class teacher can work with parents to discuss and resolve any issues. If a parent feels that an issue needs to be escalated the following process is implemented;

- 1. Class teacher
- Module Coordinator Infants Mrs Buenaventura and Primary Mrs Maher
- 3. Assistant Principal Mr Crothers
- 4. Principal Mr Kapitanow

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Principal's Message Continued

Office staff will ask questions to direct your enquiry. Whilst some parents may feel that escalating themselves directly to the Principal is appropriate this may not result in the best outcome. Ultimately I will refer issues that need to be investigated or dealt with to the most relevant member of the School Leadership Team. This ensures the best result for all.

Attendance for all students.

For many students this goal is met with little or no change to their school attendance habits. For others there is work in understanding attendance challenges and establishing a shared understanding of attendance expectations.

As a school we are currently achieving 91% student attendance. This sounds very promising, but it is an average. This means that whilst some students are achieving very positive attendance rates others are having challenges.

Our process places students into one of the following categories;

- 1. Above 90% attendance no action required
- 2. Below 90% attendance emerging attendance issue identified and a letter is sent home.
- 3. Below 85% attendance emerging attendance issue identified and regular meeting established with parents to discuss challenges.
- 4. Below 70% attendance complex attendance issue identified and system personal become involved.

Our goal is to work with parents to understand the significance of low student attendance.

Missing just 5 days a term will mean that a student will miss 48 weeks of school by year 12. This is one year of lost learning.

If you require any assistance or guidance with improving your child's attendance please make contact with the school.

Well done St Bernies!!!!


