Student Uniforms

This week we have been focusing on ensuring students are wearing their full winter school uniform. I would like to thank all parents who have been ensuring their children wear the full school uniform each and everyday and all of those parents who have begun to correct any identified problems.

Wearing the full school uniform is an expectation that all parents and students accept when they enrol at St Bernadette's. The school uniform identifies the students as members of St Bernadette's, a Catholic school that has expectations. I understand the frustration that many parents express when they consistently see students out of uniform. Wearing full school uniform is a parental responsibility. Testing the boundaries to see if you can get away with it is unfair to the rest of the community, parents, students and staff included.

Where We Learn and Grow Together

Believe it or not school staff do not want to use their time attending to students who are not wearing the full school uniform. Teachers are time poor and I would much rather they apply their time to planning and delivering lessons to students.

The amount of students not wearing full school uniform meant that an intervention was required that was both efficient and manageable for school staff. I understand that some parents feel upset that their children were identified as not complying with uniform expectations. However the following should be noted;

- This weeks uniform blitz was clearly communicated to all parents
- Uniform expectations have been published many times
- The process was done simply and respectfully.
- Students were required to attend the Student foyer of the office area. They did not enter the Principal's Office or back office area.

If you are having any difficulty with uniform expectations please communicate these to your child's class teacher or the office. There are options for families who require assistance to ensure they meet the school's uniform expectations.

Windy Weather

During times of inclement weather such as rain, extreme heat or cold and high wind students are kept inside during recess or lunch and movement around the school is minimised. This is assessed as the day progresses and changes as the weather conditions change.

Our priority is student safety.

School Band Update

This year we collaborated with staff from Captivate to revitalise the band offering at St Bernadette's. This has included a considerable investment in way of time and funds to ensure the program is well structured and adequately resourced.

At this stage all Year 4 and 5 students attend a weekly lesson with trained music teachers from Captivate. The students play an instrument that they both picked and is suitable for their age. Additionally any student who previously attended small group lessons is still able to access this service. This week we also announced that all year 5 students would have the option to take their instrument home to improve access and the ability to practise. Given the cost of the instruments we are investing a lot of trust in our students and families.

The results of our new focus are beginning to be evident! The students are starting to look and sound like a band! By the end of the year I am assured by the Captivate staff that we will have musicians who will be able to play a range of music. You can only imagine what the future will be as the amount of students exposed to music teaching and instruments increases.

At this stage we are unable to increase the amount of students receiving small group tuition. We have invested a lot in buying new instruments to ensure all students in Year 4 and 5 have access to an instrument. We are looking to expand our catalogue of instruments when funds become available.







WHO'S PEACE - JESUS OR ROME'S?

Gospel in Life

Peace. As it was defined by Jesus of Nazareth, peace was a dangerous goal for the early Christians who lived in the Roman Empire. The Roman Empire also brought "peace". But Roman leaders believed they could bring peace by conquering nations, crucifying rebels, and worshipping Roman gods. That means early Christians were radically different from their culture and their government. They followed a man who said peace comes from healing, forgiving, and serving others. They chose to worship the God who stood for sacrifice and nonviolence instead of the Roman gods, who called for war and domination.

How about us today? Our nation has resorted quickly to military solutions for global problems. Many people seek peace by ignoring their conflicts with others or by shouting down people who disagree with them.

In contrast, I know some Catholic nuns who work full time to further Christ's peace. They organise nonviolent demonstrations against the use of military force to solve world problems. They teach people about Christian movements that have brought peace to war-torn areas through nonviolence. They train people to solve problems without violent words or actions. Like the early Christians, they look pretty radical to some. They are Christian heroes to me.

Easter is a good time to ask difficult questions about our notion of peace. Do we work for peace by forgiving others or settling conflicts without violent words or actions? Do our national policies reflect Jesus' style of peacemaking or Rome's? Are we courageous enough to look as radical as our Christian ancestors?

Where do you — or where does our country — need to change in order to more effectively stand for the peace Jesus offers the world?
