From The Principal

This week we have been celebrating Book Week. The theme this year is, 'Curious Creatures, Wild Minds'. Our goal was to continue to celebrate Book Week whilst adhering to the COVID restrictions. Obviously this has created some challenges most notably the task of running a book fair whilst parents are not able to be onsite. We thank parents for their support and understanding to make this work as best we can. We hope as many families as possible take the opportunity to purchase new quality books for their homes.

Book Week is an opportunity to celebrate literacy and all its benefits. One of the primary functions of all schools is to ensure students leave being able to read, write and speak. At St Bernadette's we achieve this by ensuring literacy is a top teaching priority everyday. Students participate in two hours of targeted literacy learning. We know how each and every child is progressing and take steps to ensure learning progress is maintained.

It would be fantastic if EVERY child not just children at St Bernadette's entered adulthood with the gift of being literate. This week find the time to celebrate literacy by reading with your child, buying a new book or sharing the stories you enjoyed as a child.

This week every class teacher participated in Case Management. Case Management is a high yield strategy in which teachers identify students who are stuck in their learning. A group of staff then meet to analyse the students learning and develop possible solutions. The group meets up to three times a term to assess student progress and next step learning. We use Case Management throughout the year to assist teachers to help students whose learning has stalled. Bringing a group of teachers together to work on an identified issue dramatically increases and refines the strategies used to assist student learning.

A special thanks to the parents who have volunteered and enabled the Parent Canteen to reopen. On behalf of the Parent Group, parents, staff and importantly students we thank you for your time and support. If you can volunteer I know the Parents and students would greatly appreciate your time.

Maintenance

Kindy carpet has been replaced, YEAH! The hold up due to the Victorian lock down has been long. Staff are working on re-organising the space with the plan for Kindergarten students to be back in their normal space by next week. We thank everyone for their understanding whilst this work was being completed.

Additionally the office has been re-carpeted. New furniture has also been purchased to update some office areas and the parent foyer.

ALL SAINTS! Gospel in Life

On this festival of faith, as we celebrate the glory of countless millions of people who, down through the centuries, have gone home to God, we are given a glimpse into our ultimate future.

Those who are now gathered in heaven with Christ were men and women who toiled and suffered for the love of God.

They took their faith seriously enough to allow it to shape their lives in order to complete the task that God had given them. Few of them held important positions and many went unnoticed in their communities.

They did nothing out of the ordinary and in a short time were forgotten. The fact that their names do not appear on the church's official role of honour, reminds us that those who are canonised are only a small fraction of God's friends. We have all met men and women who lived their faith in a non-spectacular manner, as parents coping with the cares of the family and struggling to make ends meet in difficult circumstances.

They got on with what they had to do and experienced the joys and disappointments of their children growing up.

In the hard experience of life they managed to keep their sights on the living God, trusting that he would work all things for the good. Their outstanding quality was faithful perseverance in this long and painful task. This gospel paints a picture of the qualities Jesus considers necessary for making a person a saint, and they differ from what constitute earthly success and honour.

He lets us see the value of a humble daily life and how precious it can be if we take up our cross and follow him. That is the life all of us have pledged ourselves to follow.

The saints are put before us for our imitation to show us the way and point out the path we have to travel.

We need human faces and firm friends to help us in our search for God.

The example of their lives encourages us and spurs us on, telling us that our future is with God because we are already his children.

Our glorious future has to be worked out in loving service here on earth and we have been given the grace necessary to achieve it, announcing, as it does, that heaven is already within our grasp.

All Saints' Day gives us fresh courage to renew our resolve and to thank God for giving ordinary folk like us the ability to become saints.

As we honour the saints, we pray that where they are we also may one day be.
